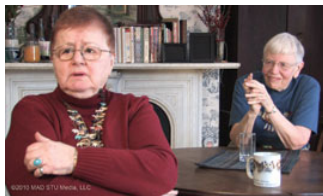
1pm SHOUTS AND MURMURS: A Program of Youthful Declarations

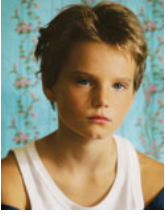
3pm GEN SILENT

The beguiling story of one 10 year-old girl who tries to pass as a boy. Set almost entirely in the world of children, *Tomboy* secures the reputation of director Céline Sciamma -- who also directed our 2008 Centerpiece *Water Lilies* -- as a true filmic poet of girlhood, as an artist of great sensitivity and revelation.

An experimental documentary of great beauty that maps a ruminative portrait of a city -- Genoa, Italy -- and of a relationship, the decades-long partnership between Enzo, an ex-con, and Mary, his transsexual lover who he met in prison.

7pm GUN HILL ROAD

(Rashaad Ernesto Green, 88min., 2011)



A powerful family melodrama about one father's reaction to his teenager's embrace of her identity. At times a harrowing drama about a family in transition, *Gun Hill Road* also offers a rich portrait of a teen in transition.
